

Real estate courses will be given here

Two University of Michigan statewide real estate courses will be given at the Western Wayne-Oakland County Board of Realtors in Farmington this fall.

The courses are "Real Estate Business II" and "Real Estate Law." They will begin the week of Sept. 13 and continue for 11 weeks. "Real Estate Business II" will meet Mondays, 6:30-10 p.m. starting Sept. 13 and "Real Estate Law" will meet Wednesdays from 7:10 p.m. beginning Sept. 15.

Students may register in the classroom during the half hour preceding the first class session. The \$80 fee for each course must be in by the end of the first week in which the second class session is held.

The U of M program which has served as a model for similar programs in Michigan and throughout the United States is in its 20th year. It is offered by the university extension service and the graduate school of business administration in cooperation with the Michigan Association of Realtors.

"Real Estate Business II" is an advanced residential brokerage course. It introduces the student to real estate market analysis, appraisal, taxation, office management, condominiums, land development, recreational real estate and closings. Suggested requisites for the course are completion of "Real Estate Business Institute I" or the equivalent.

"Real Estate Law" explains the rights and duties of all parties involved in a real estate transaction including the proper preparation of all instruments and the role of the attorney in the transfer of rights to real property. Lecture topics include land and its elements, land titles and interests in land, abstracts and title insurance, deeds, easements, liens, escrows and brokers, salespersons and the law.
