

Officials to meet on M-275 solution

Oakland County is preparing a "united front" on what alternate routes the Michigan Highway Department should improve now that it has cancelled plans to build M-275.

"We're going to have to speak with a united voice," said Patrick M. Nowak, executive officer for administration under County Executive Daniel T. Murphy. "If we speak with many voices, we'll have no solutions."

Nowak said the county executive, Chairman Wallace Gabler of the board of commissioners and Chairman John Gnaou of the Oakland County Road Commission are inviting local officials to meet this week to prepare their position.

The four-man state highway commission will hold a public hearing April 27 in Oakland County to consider alternative plans to M-275.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS last week

gave 22-2 approval to a resolution urging the highway commission to "recognize the need for a north-south" highway through the interior of Oakland County.

The \$69 million M-275 was to have run from I-96 in Novi to I-75 near Davisburg in roughly the Haggerty Road corridor.

The county board resolution, prepared by Commissioner Robert Gorsline (R-Milford), declared "a need still exists to provide some adequate north-south highway." It called on planning, road and traffic agencies to suggest alternatives to the county board and to the highway commission.

Eye bank sets sights on more eyes, cash

Last year was a memorable one for about 250 Michigan citizens, not because of the bicentennial, but because their sight was restored.

These formerly blind or visually handicapped men, women and children received corneal transplants, made possible by the Michigan Eye-Bank, which supplies free of charge, the eye tissue used in such sight-restorative surgery.

In recognition of this service, observance of "Michigan Eye-Bank Week" has been set for March 6-12.

The eye-bank is a joint project of the Lions Clubs of Michigan and the medical centers of the University of Michigan and Wayne State University.

But the compassionate people who request that their eyes be used, after death, to help restore sight to others are the ones who merit special recognition. Lawrence D. Wyman of Clare, president of the Michigan Eye-Bank, said, "Without those generous acts, the eye-bank could not exist."

It is our goal to obtain pledges of eyes and supporting funds to help everyone who can be helped to see again," Wyman added.

Veterans' kin may be eligible

Veterans Administration mental health services can be extended to family members of veterans, but only under circumstances which are carefully spelled out in the Veterans Omnibus Health Care Act of 1976.

The law, enacted last October, authorizes mental health services, consultation, professional counseling and training for family members of a veteran receiving medical care for a service-connected disability, but only if the care is considered essential to the rehabilitation of the veteran.

Similar health services may be authorized in some instances for family members of veterans with nonservice-connected disabilities, a VA spokesman said. Family care will be provided on an outpatient basis in those cases where it is deemed essential in affecting release of a veteran from a hospital.

Legal guardians, or an individual, in whose household the veteran certifies an intention to live, also may qualify for VA mental health services the spokesman added. Services will be limited to those which are essential to support rehabilitation of the veteran.

Complete information of health care services available to veterans and their dependents may be obtained at any VA office or from service officers of the major veterans organizations.
