Bond Has New Tax Idea

Howard Bond is a candidate for the charter commission from Farmington Township who would like to see a new zone concept on taxation incorporated into the charter.

Bond has lived in Farmington Township since he was five

years old and is the son of a former township supervisor.

He is a senior member of a municipal law firm which serves Quakertown, North, West Lake, Bloomfield Township and Southfield.

Bond drafted the charter for the new city of Novi and has drafted two other charters besides assisting in the writing of two more.

If elected to the charter commission, Bond says he will attempt to write into the document a zone taxation system.

UNDER the plan, the new city would levy a general tax for all areas. But it would levy separate taxes for special districts within the new city. The special tax would be for services and would be established according to the services the people desire in each district and according to their ability to pay.

Under this plan, those residents who don't want certain services wouldn't be required to pay taxes for them while the city would still be able to provide those services to residents who want them.

Bond says the system has never been tried before in Mich.

Welding Students Learn Techniques

Farmington schools and community members of the vocational welding craft committee held their first meeting Oct. 22. A list of equipment needed for vocational welding was drawn up, and the skills and knowledge to be acquired through the course were agreed upon.

Students enrolling for training should learn the safe setup and operation of welding equipment.

They should learn welding of flats, vertical, horizontal and overhead. Reading of prints and scales and the use of square, protractor, and dividers should be mastered as should welding of dissimilar gauges and various shapes.

Students should acquire an understanding of the function of the welding process and of the arc welder and understand its concepts. They should know terminology and types of arc welders.

Identification of common metals and their shapes, types of welds and an understanding of ferrous and non-ferrous metals should also be part of their training.
