Survivors include brothers, Edgar, Alfred, Walter; sisters, Mrs. Ethel Ash and Mrs. Hilda Nacker.

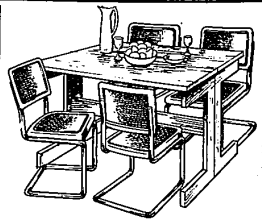

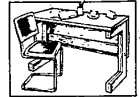

## Electoral College reform is AJC topic

The American Jewish Congress, 21751 Nine Mile, Southfield, is taking reservations for its open board meeting at 8 p.m. on June 7.

Topic of the meeting will be the implications for the Jewish community of changing our present method of electing the President of the United States from the Electoral College system to one of direct popular election.

According to Rush S. Rosenbaum, regional director of the American Jewish

Congress, there is legislation pending in the U.S. Senate aimed at eliminating the Electoral College System.

"On the surface direct popular election of a president may seem to be an improvement over our present system, but there are many factors which should make us examine this issue very carefully," she said.

"How will it affect minority groups and those who live in large metropolitan areas? Jews as a minority tend

live in those urban centers.

"How will it affect our traditional two party system? And how will such a system deal with 'single issue' groups which may proliferate and prevent a major party candidate from achieving the percentage needed to win an election?"

Discussions on this issue will be professors of political science from area universities including: Dr. Bernard Klein of the University of Michigan-Dearborn Campus and Dr. Carl Vann of Oakland University.
