Westland Girl Cast As Kate In Bonstelle

Shakespeare's perennial favorite, "The Taming of the Shrew" is the first production of the new year at the Bonstelle Theatre.

"The Taming of the Shrew" is an early Shakespeare comedy and shows he learned his craft rapidly. Here he brought new life to a farcical theme that has entertained men and women since the beginning of time—the eternal war between the sexes and the situation

this warfare creates.

The cast is headed by Lucille Williams of Westland, and Stuart B. Grant as the warring Kate and Petruchio.

Other leading roles are played by Judi Edwards as Bianca, Gordon Mayer as Hortensio, James Phipps as Lucentio, William Feinberg as Baptista, Donald Dailey as Gremio, and David Patrick Kelly as Grimo.

The production is directed by N. Joseph Calarco. Settings are designed by Norman Hamilton, costumes by Stephanie Schaefer and lighting by Tom Bryan.

St. John Chorus To Sing In Area

The Men's Chorus of St. John University in Collegeville, Minn. will sing Wednesday, Feb. 4 in the Plymouth High School gymnasium. Concert time is 8 p.m.

The award-winning group is under the direction of Alex Theimer.

THE PLYMOUTH appearance is under the sponsorship of the Plymouth High School vocal department.

This is Theimer's first year at the university and his first year in this country. Prior to this time, he was director of the "Chorus Viennensis," composed of former members of the Vienna Boys Choir.

The St. John Chorus has toured Europe four times during the past nine years. The group has logged more than 20,000 miles in Germany, Austria, Italy, Switzerland and England.

The Plymouth visit is part of the 1970 American Tour of the Chorus. During this trip, the company will visit New York City for a recording session with NBC radio for the Great Chorus of America series.

SINGING a capella and with piano accompaniment, the chorus will present a variety of music ranging from 16th century classics to works by contemporary composers and will include international folk songs and spirituals.

The program will also include three numbers by the select Madrigal Singers. Tickets may be purchased at the high school or from members of the vocal music department faculty.

Sign Up For Ski Lessons

If you want to learn the basics of skiing or even improve your skills on the slope, you still have time to sign up for the second session of instruction offered by the Livonia Ski School.

The school sponsors evening instruction periods at the southeastern ski resort of Mt. Brighton.

THE INSTRUCTION periods begin at 6 p.m. on Thursday and Friday nights and the new session is scheduled for Jan. 29 through March 1.

By joining the school (the registration fee is \$1 per person) the Mt. Brighton lessons are priced at \$3.25 if you have your own equipment and \$5.50 if you rent the skis and boots.

In order to qualify for this special rate, the backers of the ski school must turn out 150 skiers on Thursday nights and 250 on Friday nights.

IF YOU participated in the first session of the school, you need not re-register. Your registration cards are valid for the second session.
