Farmington Hills woman killed while driving to meet husband

Paul and Catherine Lampinen of Farmington Hills had planned to begin their Southern vacation today. But a traffic accident in Plymouth Township two days ago claimed her life and injured the couple's four children.

Mrs. Lampinen, 28, and the children, ranging in age from 6 weeks to 10 years, had been en route to deliver lunch to Lou LaRiche Chevrolet, when the accident occurred a mile from the dealership at about noon Tuesday.

Witnesses told Wayne County Sheriff's deputies that the Lampinen car was traveling on Haggerty Road at least 75 mph — about 30 mph over the speed limit — when it struck another car and careened off the roadway.

The car rolled 530 feet before stopping in the Burrough Corp. parking lot just north of Plymouth Road.

Mrs. Lampinen was thrown 107 feet from the car after it stopped tumbling, according to Officer John Young. She was pronounced dead on arrival at St. Mary Hospital.

"This is as big a mystery to us as

everyone else," he said. "We don't know what caused her to drive in this fashion. There's a lot of unexplained things here."

One child, Joseph, 7, was found a few feet from the car. Listed in very serious condition at St. Mary, he was transferred to Children's Hospital in Detroit later that afternoon. He sustained head injuries and multiple cuts.

BY WEDNESDAY, Amy, 6 weeks, had been released from St. Mary while her other two brothers, Tim, 4, and Paul Jr., were listed in stable condition there. The brothers had multiple cuts.

Witnesses told police they first spotted the Lampinen car when it drove through a red light at the Haggerty-Schoolcraft intersection.

It continued south on Haggerty, striking a car driven by a Northville man, Bert Tripp, as it appeared to pass the Tripp car in the southbound lane.

Police say the Lampinen car then appeared to lose control. It careened off the shoulder of the road, severing a telephone pole and "flipping end over end," Young said.

The Tripp car, struck in the left rear end, was not seriously damaged.

Police did not know where the children were seated in the car as three of them had been in the care of witnesses upon arrival of rescue officials and police. Plymouth Township rescue workers administered first aid to the children and took them to St. Mary.

It's not known if seat belts were used.

Police said the car stopped tumbling when it lost momentum. It landed on its tires. The Lampinens' 1974 Plymouth appeared totally demolished.

Witnesses say the car's parts began dislodging during the 530-foot roll. The front hood flew off and struck a parked brown Mercury in the Burroughs lot.

The dealership's sales manager, Ron Chaudon, said Lampinen, 30, and his family planned to take a week's vacation somewhere in the South beginning Thursday.

Mrs. Lampinen and the children were returning from a dental appointment when they decided to bring Lampinen's lunch.

Lampinen has been employed at the Plymouth Township car business for about a year, said Chaudon.
