APRIL

Harrison's Rudel, who won to freestyle events at the state Class B swimming finals, was named to the first team of the Observer & Eccentric's All-Area Team. . . North Farmington outran Livonia Franklin, 98-34, in a Northwest Suburban League boys' track meet. . . Nancy Green, who passed up a chance for stardom on Harrison's girls' tennis team, played at No. 3 singles for Harrison's boys' team. . . Tom McPhillips, Oakland Community College's basketball coach, decided to stay at the Farmington Hills school at least for one more year.

MAY

West Bloomfield's first-year girls' soccer team beat established North Farmington, 1-0. . . North Farmington won the city boys' track title, scoring 70 points to Farmington High's 67 1/2 and Harrison's 29 1/2. . . Farmington High pitcher John Dunn struck out 16 and allowed two hits in the Falcons' 8-1 baseball win over Pontiac Northern. . . Harrison's tennis team, led by Nancy Green and Rick Kovan, advanced to the state Class B finals by finishing second in regional competition. . . Seven area girls — Harrison's Beth Dilley and Linda Tremont, Mercy's Sonya Horvath and Beth Bosse, Farmington High's Julie Tadrzynski and Chris Looser, and North's Nancy Hughes — earned places in the girls' track finals. . . North Farmington won boys' track and tennis championships. . . North's Rich Nutter pitched a perfect game in a 13-0 baseball win over Redford. . . In a predistrict baseball, Farmington High upset highly-rated Plymouth Canton, 5-3. . . Farmington High's Craig Kiely won the Oakland County high jump title with a 6-foot-5 effort.

JUNE

Mercy's Meg Mallon shot a nine-over-par 82 to

lead here team to a fourth place finish in the girls' state golf tournament at Burroughs Farms Golf Course near Brighton. . . Harrison's Beth Dilley placed fifth in the 200-meter low hurdles at the Class B girls' track finals at Sturgis High School. . . In tournament softball, Mercy blanked Farmington High, 2-0, and then lost to West Bloomfield in the district final on Farmington's Knights of Columbus Field. . . North's baseball team, which beat Plymouth Salem for the district title, lost to Wayne Memorial, 2-0, in the regional. . . Meanwhile, Harrison's baseball team enjoyed a long tournament run after a lackluster 8-13 regular season. . . Harrison scored 66 runs in six tournament games and won district and regional titles before dropping a 7-0 decision to Flint Powers in the Class B semifinal in Lansing. . . Erick Iskresky beat West Bloomfield's Mark Pinchoff in the open flight of the Teen Man Tennis Tournament at the Detroit Tennis and Squash Club in Farmington Hills.

JULY

The Bonaventure Speed Club, a Farmington-based roller skating team coached by Vince Dooley, finished second in regional competition to qualify for the national championships in Lincoln, Neb. . . Farmington-West, Bloomfield's Sandy Koufax (12-14 year olds) baseball team closed out its regular season with a double header sweep of Brighton at West Bloomfield High. . . For the first time, the spectators were allowed to cast ballots to decide the winner of the sportsmanship award at the Farmington Youth Fitness Meet at Farmington High School. . . The Farmington Founders' Festival Mini-Marathon was scaled down from 10 miles to two shorter races — five and 2 1/2-mile runs through a subdivision through the sponsoring Farmington-Area YMCA. . . Jeff Poleck won the men's five-mile race, and Annette Ison won the women's five-mile race. . . Country Lanes, managed by Gary Garrant, won the Founders' Festival softball tournament with a 20-5 thumping of Cafe Fior in the finals. . . Oscar Ziemba, a 49-year-old Farm-

ington Hills resident, won two championships in the Founders' Festival tennis tournament.

AUGUST

South Farmington's Pony League baseball team, a collection of 13-and-14 year-old all-stars, won a district championship before losing to Garden City, 4-2, in the opening game of the Pony State Tournament. . . Jack O'Connell, a Farmington youngster, finished second in the softball throw with a toss of 208 feet to lead Farmington's efforts in the Detroit Metropolitan Youth Fitness Meet on Detroit's Belle Isle. . . The Farmington Angels, a women's soccer team coached by John Magee, defeated Ann Arbor, 3-2, to win the Great Lakes Women's Soccer League title. . . n. Waterford Township's Mark Syron shot an even-par 70 to win his age division (the boys' 13-15 Golden Masters) and top the field of 71 young golfers at the semifinals of the Detroit Walter Hagen Junior Golf Championship at Glen Oaks Golf Course in Farmington Hills. . . Old Farm's swimming team, coached by Frank Sugrue, defended its 174-City Swim League title by winning the league meet. . . NF-WB's Sandy Koufax baseball team, managed by Carl Childress, won the state championship and qualified for the American Baseball Conference Koutax World Series in Knoxville, Tenn. The Bonaventure Speed Club returned from Lincoln, Neb., with its second-straight national roller skating championship.
