A memorial service will be held at 2 p.m. Friday in the auditorium of the architectural building on the LIT campus. Thomas Masson, associate professor of humanities, student library assistant Michael Rose, and Phillip's long-time friend Morley Wilson will speak. Phillip's body will be cremated.

Phillips, 60, graduated from the University of Michigan in 1949 and received his MBA from Michigan State University in 1958. He also took additional studies toward an M.A.L.S. at

Michigan State University.

A resident of Southfield, Phillips served as associate director of the Ingham County Library from 1964 to 1968 and had earlier worked for General Electric as a specialist in employment practices and employee benefits, as personnel manager with the John Widdicombe Furniture Co., and as an employment manager with Stewart Warner Corp.

He was a veteran of World War II, serving with the Navy Pharmacist Corps in the Pacific. He received two Purple Hearts and was awarded the Navy-Marine Corps Medal for Heroism.

He is survived by his wife Edith and two children, Kirk and Sara.
