

# Tom Tomkow and Greg Bosscawen

## Area gymnasts help MSU

Depth has not been a problem for Michigan State's men's gymnastics squad this season, and the consistent performances of two North Farmington graduates, Tom Tomkow and Greg Bosscawen, are part of the reason.

Senior Tomkow and junior Bosscawen both have contributed top performances to help the Spartans compile a 3-1 dual-meet record.

Although Tomkow missed last season because of a knee injury, the four-year veteran of the still rings easily came back this year to post an average score of 9.14.

His season high of 9.45 helped MSU beat Illinois-Chicago Circle, 264.70-

254.00. The Spartans lost to the University of Iowa by .45 of a point the same day.

"Tom is having a fine season and continues to make improvements," said George Sypula, MSU's longtime men's gymnastics coach. "He's one of the top three ringmen in the Big Ten and has a very good chance of qualifying for the nationals in April."

Tomkow says he concentrates mainly on his swing while working the rings. "Most gymnasts have felt strength was the most important factor on the rings," he said, "but I've always enjoyed the swing aspect and have concentrated on that."

Tomkow added, "My main goal for the season is to be happy with what I'm doing. My motivation to do well comes from the guys on the team. The close-knit team atmosphere makes me want to do well and push myself."

Tomkow is a hotel-restaurant management major at MSU.

BOSSCAWEN, NOW in his third year with the Spartans, has made great improvements in his floor exercise and parallel bar routines.

As one of MSU's top men on parallel bars, he is averaging 8.5 with a season high of 9.15.
