Walled Lake eyes millage rate increases

The Walled Lake Board of Education tentatively has scheduled Thursday, April 9 as the date for a millage election.  
But the question of how much millage and for how long are undecided. The board will address those questions at a special study session 7:30 p.m. Wednesday in the Walled Lake Central auditorium.  
Board President Stephen Lasher said citizens will be invited to express their feelings about a millage proposal at the study session.  
It is uncertain whether the board will

proceed with plans to conduct a millage election April 9.  
Deputy Superintendent Roland Langman was directed to reserve that date with the Oakland County Elections Division in the event the board decided to proceed with a millage election.  
In making the motion, Trustee Betty Campion said the date can be cancelled if the board decides at Wednesday's meeting not to seek additional millage.  
Opposition to reserving the date was expressed by Trustee Janet Callahan who noted that the regular school

board election falls in June.  
THE BOARD is expected to review two reports submitted by a special citizens committee charged with studying the district's financial situation.  
One of those reports — the chairperson's report — state the committee's plurality position of seeking three mills for two years.  
The other report — the minority report — recommends that a continuing advisory committee be appointed to "explore, evaluate and make available to the board, the development of information to enable the board to make new kinds of choices in financial planning."

Assistant Superintendent for Business Harry Carlson projected that the Walled Lake District will have an \$829,300 deficit during the 1980-81 school year.  
Carlson projected the deficit in 1981-82 will be \$815,800. That deficit does not include pay raises for school employees beyond the regular incremental increases.

Superintendent Don Sheldon said that it will be necessary to identify \$4.5 million in budget cuts unless additional revenues are secured.
