Israeli singer Geula Gill has been signed to appear with Bill Cosby at Hill Day School of Farmington Hills concert at 8:30 p.m. March 14 at Ford Auditorium, Detroit.

The vocalist, who has a three-octave range, sings cultural, Hebrew and modern Israeli songs, as well as international tunes and Broadway classics. She sings in 10 languages.

Besides appearing solo, she has accompanied many performers including Theodore Bikel, David Brenner, Hershel Bernardi, Jerry Lewis, Ben Vereen and Don Rickles in concert. She is the only Israeli to win a Tony Award nomination for her Broadway performance in the show "The Grand Music Hall of Israel."

Ms. Gill was named best female vocalist in the Rio De Janeiro Song Festival and appeared in the Soviet Union in a nine-week cultural exchange tour.
