A delicately laced Australian wedding cake by Oakland Community College student Tom Keeley of Berkley has earned him one of the three "Auggie" awards given annually by the Michigan Restaurant Association for culinary accomplishment by young chefs. In addition to Keeley's award as top college student, Auggies were given to the top apprentice and top high school student.

Daniel Drumlake of Novi, an OCC student and employee of Travis Point Country Club in Ann Arbor, was named top apprentice. Mark Secker of Plymouth, a junior at Plymouth-Canton High won the Auggie in the high school division.  
 The Auggie awards — the Oscars of the food service industry — are granted under guidelines established by the American Culinary Federation, ACF judges from Michigan and Ontario rated student selections at the annual

food service show at Cobo Hall on April 5.  
 Entrants are required to enter at least one item from one of the following categories: hors d'oeuvres, meat, seafood, pate/mousses/gallatinie, individual dinner dishes, restaurant platters, centerpieces, cakes, petits fours, breads and french pastries. Entries are judged on composition, presentation, originality and workmanship. A total of twenty medals were

awarded to OCC culinary arts students. Gold medal recipients included Edwin Buford of Highland, Tom Keeley, Susan Miller of Farmington Hills and Donald Palmer of Berkley.  
 College students who won silver medals are David Auer of Bloomfield Hills, Kathryn Cassette of New Baltimore, Daniel Drumlake, Tom Keeley, and Brian Tanner of West Bloomfield. Dan Drumlake also won the only silver medal awarded to an apprentice.

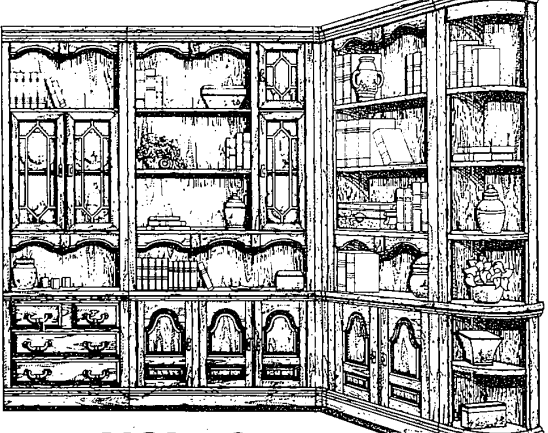

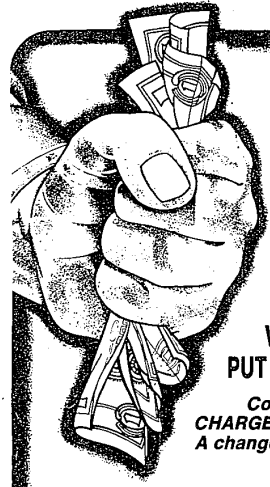
