Old Village tour planned

Guests are invited to tour Farmington's historic district when Lee Peel heads up "The Houses of Farmington's Old Village" that begins at 7 p.m. on Monday, May 18.

Guests will convene in Farmington Community Library's auditorium, 2500 Liberty Street, where Peel will illustrate a discussion of the various architectural styles in the area with a slide presentation.

"The guided tour will give program participants a feeling of Farmington's heritage," said Beverly Daffern of the library.

Walkers will go from the oldest home in Farmington, which was built by Percy Power in 1824, to the Governor's Mansion of Fred M. Warner to the Greek Revival structures along Shiawassee Road.

Although many of the houses have had additions or modifications, and all have electricity and in-door plumbing now, each has retained the charm of its era.

Guests are asked to wear their walking shoes for the walk led by Peel, who is the author of "Farmington: A Pictorial History."

There is no charge for the event but the library staff requests reservations by calling the library, 474-7770.




