Some of the top athletes participating include half-milers Jay Berwick of Birmingham Groves and Mike Kavulich of Berkeley; distance runners Tim Cannon of Bloomfield Hills Cranbrook, Matt Stack of Holly and Jim Elliott of Royal Oak Denard; pole vaulters Jim Roth of Birmingham Seaholm and Scott Campbell of Waterford Kettering; hurdlers Paul Niemi of Oxford and Dale Washington of Pontiac Northern; shot putters and discus throwers Dan Kenwell of West Bloomfield and Darrell Troxell of Waterford Kettering; long jumper Freeman Donloe of Southfield High;

and high jumpers Steve Wyckoff of Clarkston and Craig Kieley of Farmington.

Pontiac Northern features two of the state's top sprinters — Reggie Williams and Hank Brooks. Williams' best 100-yard dash time is 9.9 seconds.

Brooks clocks at 10.0.

Kim McCoy is Northern's top quarter-miler (49.5), while teammate Jeff Mack excels in the 220-yard dash (22.3). The Huskies also have strong 440-yard relay, 880-yard and one-mile relay teams.
