Suzuki concert in park June 3

The Plymouth Suzuki Institute will present a free concert from 4:45-5:45 p.m. on Wednesday, June 3, in Kellogg Park, downtown Plymouth.

The young violinists will perform works by Bach, Vivaldi, Handel, Schumann and Rameau. The institute is composed of children ages 4-14 who come from Plymouth, Canton, Northville, Livonia, Farmington, Novi and Southfield to study the Suzuki method.

The Japanese musician founded the method on the premise that children can learn to play a musical instrument the same way they learn to talk — by simply listening and imitating the sounds.

The public is invited to take along a blanket or folding chair to sit on during the concert. The city of Plymouth will provide its bare shell for the event, and Arnold Williams Music will provide the piano for accompaniment.
