**Walled Lake ponders \$23 million budget**

A 1981-82 proposed \$23.89 million budget is up for consideration at tonight's Walled Lake Board of Education meeting.

A public hearing on the budget is 7:30 p.m. at the board's administrative offices.

Following the hearing, the board will convene in its regular session to consider adoption of the budget.

The proposed budget was presented to the board for preliminary review last Monday.

The cuts were necessary despite voter approval of a four-mill renewal proposal on June 2.

The proposed budget reflects a decrease of 25 teaching and three administrative positions.

The proposed budget anticipates revenues of \$27,835,945 and proposed expenditures of \$43,690,050 — a deficit of approximately \$15,855,000.

Superintendent Don Sheldon said the deficit will be eliminated by using \$1,055 million from the fund equity (savings) account, which is expected to contain approximately \$1,647 million at the end of the current school year.

Sheldon also noted the balanced budget was achieved by implementing approximately \$1.6 million in cuts previously reviewed by the board.

The district anticipates \$20,918 million in revenues coming from property taxes, \$926,000 in state aid and \$135,000 from Oakland County for special education and vocational education programming.

Harry Carlson, assistant superintendent of business, said revenues from local property taxes increased approximately \$3 million during the past year, but state aid revenues have dropped from about \$2.5 million in 1980-81 to an estimated \$926,000 in the 1981-82 school year.
