

U-M shuffles program in real estate

The University of Michigan's Real Estate Program will continue under the reorganized extension office as the university re-examines off-campus credit and non-credit instruction.

The real estate program will be included in that study. The program began in 1947 under the sponsorship of the U-M Extension Service in cooperation with the U-M Graduate School of Business Administration and the Michigan Association of Realtors. More than 3,000 professionals have been awarded certificates under the program.

However, as part of the university's retrenchment plan caused by a reduction in 1980-81 state appropriation, the Extension Service has recently been reorganized to save about \$1.2 million in the general fund budget.

"We are sympathetic with the concerns raised by professionals about the future of the real estate program at the university, and gratified that this program has proven to be of such importance to the profession," said B. E. Pope, U-M vice president for academic affairs.

One possibility being explored, he said, is to relocate the real estate program in the U-M Graduate School of Business Administration.

"But we must be sure that the program be self-supporting and that its quality meet the academic standards of the university and the School of Business Administration in particular.

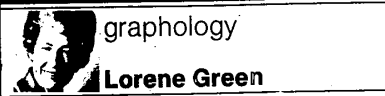
"We shall need the support of the real estate profession in order to be successful in this. I am hopeful that we not only will be able to continue our real estate program at the university, but to strengthen it."
