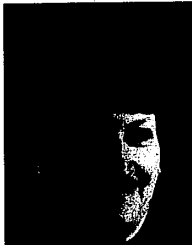


Loretta Conway takes St. Catherine Medal

Loretta Conway, the senior adult supervisor of Farmington Hills Parks and Recreation Senior Adult Program was voted by the administration and faculty of Madonna College to receive the St. Catherine Undergraduate Achievement Medal.

Each year the Detroit Chapter of Kappa Gamma Pi awards the medal to a woman student from each Kappa-affiliated college in this area.

The decision is based on scholarship ability, leadership qualities and service on campus and in the community.

Ms. Conway, who is now vice president of Marian Oakland West executive board, has served on that board since 1978.

She was an original appointee to the Farmington Area Commission on Aging and now serves as liaison to the commission for the city of Farmington Hills.

She has been a field placement supervisor for Madonna College, the Institute of Gerontology, the University of Michigan and Eastern and Oakland universities.

MS. CONWAY has been a resident of Farmington Hills for the past 24 years. During that time she has been involved as a volunteer for Head Start, the United Foundation, Women's Auxiliary Little League Baseball and the religious

program at Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Church.

She is in her senior years as a student at Madonna. She is pursuing a bachelor of science degree with a double major in gerontology and social work.

In her job as supervisor of the area senior adult program, she oversees all activities in The Gathering Place, located in Mercy Center, and was the driving force in initiating such a spot for seniors to congregate here six years ago.

Used books are sorted, packed and ready for sale

Much like Santa Claus' workshop on Dec. 23, the Farmington Branch of American Association of University Women's (AAUW) workshop for the fall used-book sale is pretty close to being packed and ready for transport.

Since early spring, local AAUW members have been going to and from the workshop behind Dinkel Middle School to sort and pack the thousands of books donated for resale.

Sale hours will be from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. on Thursday through Saturday, and from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday, Sept. 17-20, in Livonia Mall, Seven Mile and Middlebelt roads, Livonia.

Proceeds from the sale are used to further education, both nationally and locally. Some is used to support local community projects.

Looking at the near 7,000 cartons of books crowding the room, Perle Briggs, co-chairwoman of the workshop committee with Nancy Davis this year, commented on the high quality of the books that are ready for sale.

"The 'almost-new' category is large and very good," she said. "These are the practically new books that can be used as gifts, and this year we have a good number of children's books in this section."

THE AAUW was the recipient of a large library of a Farmington resident who died last year.

"The library reflects the fact that he was both a naturalist and historian, so we'll have a good many books on ecology, natural history and history to offer," she said.

Collectors will be interested in the collection of very old books. "They always sell early," she said.

"Collectors of books on gardening, environment, Michigan and the status of women will also find a good selection this year," she said.

"We never have enough cookbooks," she added, "but what we have are excellent, and that includes the 'First Ladies' Cook Book' with recipes from the White House."

The job for those on the workshop committee grinds down as the committee headed by Jean Moran gears up to transport the books to the mall.

A tradition from former sales will be repeated this year when AAUW offers its bag sale on Sunday. Shoppers may buy by the bag from books remaining after the selective shoppers have made their choices.
