At last Friday's bargaining session, Hoshach said Kichikian demanded "concessions" such as provisions that would make union membership voluntary, give the employer the right to job out work to non-union firms and remove the union dues "check-off" procedure, forcing employees to mail dues to the union.

A negotiation session between Forge union representatives and an attorney for Kichikian is set for 10 a.m. Friday.
