## Rochester wins with heroics

Liz Hofh canned the winning basket as time expired to lift Rochester to a thrilling 38-37 upset over West Bloomfield Thursday.

The first and second halves were like two different games. The Falcons trailed, 24-10, at intermission but roared back to outscore the Lakers, 23-13, in the final stanza.

With three seconds left, West Bloomfield's Kristi Thomas hit the bottom end of a one-and-one to put the Lakers in front, 37-35.

But, Hofh hauled down the rebound and with one second left, sank the winning basket.
