

Mayor appointed to energy board

Farmington Hills Mayor Don Wolf has been appointed to the Ann Arbor Energy Advisory Board by Mayor Louis D. Becher. His appointment was approved and confirmed by the Ann Arbor City Council.

The newly formed board has the responsibility of guiding the council on energy-conservation programs and capital expenditures related to an overall energy plan for the city of Ann Arbor.

"I am extremely pleased that I have the opportunity of serving the city of Ann Arbor," Wolf said. "My office is here, and I feel like a part of the community. In addition to contributing to Ann Arbor, I am sure I will gain a great deal of knowledge that will be helpful to me as a member of the Farmington Hills City Council."

"I know Mayor Wolf, and I am certainly familiar with Farmington Hills. I am delighted he has agreed to serve on the board," Becher said. "His experience as a fellow mayor and council member, along with his professional knowledge in the energy field, will add significantly to the board's stature and work. This is a real plus for Ann Arbor," Becher said.

Becher said he is asking the board to study a series of aggressive sweeping energy-related proposals that will result in energy conservation and renewable resources.

"The board's top priority is to look closely at the possibility of generating hydroelectric power at the city's four dams along the Huron River. If recommended, the project, which would probably require a bond issue on the April ballot, could save the city fuel and money," Becher said.

Other energy-related matters to be studied by the board include expansion of a recycling program and the possible use of refuse-derived fuel, Becher said.

Judith McCombs wins endowment

Judith McCombs, 42, of Farmington has been awarded a National Endowment for the Humanities one-year college teachers fellowship for 1982-83. Ms. McCombs is associate professor at the Center for Creative Studies — College of Art and Design in Detroit, where she teaches courses in creative writing and literature.

She has also published several books, including "Sisters and Other Selves" (Glass Bell Press, Detroit 1976). Her second book "Against Nature: Wilderness Poems" (Dustbooks, Paradise, Calif., 1979) based on backpacking across the United States and Canada, received excellent critical reviews in American Library Association Booklist, Great Lakes Review and Western Humanities Review.

In 1981 the National Endowment for the Humanities accepted more than 700 applications for college teachers fellowships. Fewer than 140 were granted.

Ms. McCombs will use the fellowship

year to draft a critical book on the work of Canadian writer Margaret Atwood.

Atwood, 42, has written 14 books of poetry, fiction and criticism. Her work has received international scholarship attention and now is translated into 10 languages.

ONE OF THE unique courses that Mrs. McCombs developed at CCS is a study of literature of the supernatural. "The work of researching and teaching this course helped me recognize the Gothic characteristics in Atwood's work," she said.

Ms. McCombs has published and presented many articles and conference papers focusing on some of the multiple aspects of Atwood's work.

"This fellowship will allow me to research the Gothic tradition behind Atwood's works more thoroughly and draft a scholarly book that attempts to analyze her work as a complex whole," Ms. McCombs said.
