Ross launches fight to withhold aid

Sen. Doug Ross (D-Southfield) and Urban League Executive Director Roy Williams have announced a campaign to deny state tax-exempt status to private schools that racially discriminate.

"The recent decision of the Reagan Administration to give tax-exempt status to private schools that deny students admission based on the color of their skin is unconscionable backsliding in the fight for racial equality in America," Ross said.

"Therefore, I will be introducing legislation this week to deny state tax exemptions and tax credits to any school in Michigan that discriminates on the basis of race."

"A tax exemption or tax credit granted by a government is the community's way of approving and encouraging particular activities," explained Urban League Director Williams.

"To give tax-exempt status to schools that won't admit someone because he or she is black or brown or yellow or white is to turn America back to the days of Jim Crow. We, in Michigan, regardless of race or religion, must make absolutely clear that we will not turn our backs on the fight

for racial equality whatever the Administration in Washington chooses to do," Williams said.

The legislation proposed by Ross and endorsed by Williams would do the following:

- Deny schools that discriminate on the basis of race the local property tax exemption offered educational institutions.
- Deny individuals who contribute

to private schools that racially discriminate the credit on their state income tax offered for contributions to private schools.

• Deny businesses that contribute to schools that racially discriminate the tax credit on the Single Business Tax offered for contributions to private schools.

Action in Lansing is necessary because of a recent decision by the Reagan Administration to rescind a long-standing federal anti-discrimination policy, Ross said.
