FARMINGTON The Alta Loma Homeowners Association has engaged an attorney to study the City of Farmington's recent apartment zoning ordinance.

The homeowners threatened a lawsuit at the time the city council approved deluxe apartment zoning for property owned by C.R. Kelly on the west side of Farmington Rd. between Alta Loma and Freedom Drive.

Kelly, developer of the Alta Loma Subdivision, has received plenty of opposition from his former customers since the time he first suggested building the apartments.

JOHN STENSON, president of the Alta Loma group, says the association has engaged Paul Hartly to research the rezoning decision and make an evaluation on possible litigation.

Hartly, who has offices in Southfield, was described by Stenson as an experienced attorney who has specialized in zoning matters.

Decision to engage Hartly was made during a meeting of the association April 9 by a unanimous vote. The recommendation came from the association's law committee composed of William Maitland, chairman; Margorie Williams; Harvey Bok and Ed Sikora.

Maitland will be making further announcements relative to legal action which might be taken at a later date.

THE APRIL 8 meeting was held despite confusion over where the members should meet.

Three weeks ago, Stenson explained, the association made arrangements with a local bank to hold its meeting in the bank's community meeting room.

Notices were sent out 10 days in advance to members, says Stenson, as required by the group's bylaws. But the night before the meeting, the association was notified the meeting room had been scheduled for another group.
