

Take your choice of classes to fight winter blahs

The Ten Mile Community School has launched another season of classes with some old favorites.

Classes begin the week of Jan. 17. Interested persons may register either by mail or in person at the Ten Mile School, 32789 Ten Mile, Farmington 47024.

Register before the first class period by mail or at Ten Mile Community School after Jan. 3 weekdays 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. or 7-9 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Fees are payable at the time of registration. No further notification will be given mail registrants. Plan to attend the first class meeting.

Refunds will be granted when classes are canceled. All other requests must be made to the Community Education Office before the second class meeting. A \$20 registration fee will be deducted in the case of withdrawal.

Farmington School District resident senior citizens (60 or over) are eligible for one free registration except in limited enrollment classes (indicated by a "Seasined Citizens Cards" and identification numbers (available at the Ten Mile Community School) must be procured prior to registration.

Following is a list of day classes, their times and tuition.

Classes are eight weeks unless otherwise indicated.

HEAD SCULPTURE — Monday, 3:45-4:45, Room 1, \$8. Using clay learn to build a head, self-portrait or mask. Glazing and staining and firing will be included. Ages 8 to teens. Materials \$2. Class meets five weeks.

PERSONAL TYPING — Wednesday, 4:30-5:30 p.m., Room 2. Fee \$18. Student must be in the 6th grade or above. This course is a beginning class in personal typing designed especially for the young people. Electric typewriter. Bring your own paper, supplies.

POM PONS & CHEERLEADING — Tuesday, 5:30-6:30 p.m., CC Room. Fee \$15. For girls in grades 1-4. Basic pom routines taught to popular music. Areas of concentration will include form, simile and poise.

POM PONS — Thursday, 5:30-6:30 p.m. CC Room. Fee \$15. For girls in grades 5-8. Pom routines will be taught to popular music.

READING IMPROVEMENT — Thursday, 5-6 p.m., Room 5. Fee \$16. For students in grades 2-5. This is a class designed to help children improve basic skill. Limit eight students.

READING IMPROVEMENT — Thursday, 4-5 p.m., room 5. Fee \$16. For students in grades 6-9. This is a class designed to help those who need to improve basic skills. Efforts will be made to improve speed and comprehension on an individual basis. Limit 10 students.

SILK SCREEN T-SHIRT — Wednesday, 8:45-9:45 a.m., Room 1. Fee \$8. Learn how to design and print your own personal T-shirt, creatively. Ages 8 to teens. Material fee extra (under \$3 plus your T shirt) Class meets five weeks.

THE EXERCISE MOVEMENT — Wednesday, 3:30-4:30 p.m., CC room. Fee \$15. This class begins with warm-ups and moves into dance exercise routines while following the beat of popular music. For those in grades 6-8.

ART TECHNIQUES, AN INTRODUCTION — Tuesday, 12-2:30 p.m., room 1. Fee \$2. A chance to learn different art techniques will be provided in this class. Select materials you want to explore in the areas of drawing - pencil, charcoal or ink; painting - oil, acrylic or water color; clay - hand-built or wheel-thrown.

QUILT MAKING (PATCHWORK) — Tuesday, 1-3 p.m., room 9. Fee \$20. In this class you will learn how to make patchwork quilts by hand from start to finish. Each week a different aspect of quilting will be covered. You will also work on your own quilts in patterns of your choice. Bring to first class: notebook, ruler, scissors, needle, thread and cotton or cotton scraps washed and pressed. Class maximum \$15.

ACCOUNTING AND BOOKKEEPING I — Thursday, 1-3 p.m., room 7. Fee \$20. The fundamentals of bookkeeping and principles of accounting procedures will be taught. Books sold at first class.

OFFICE PROCEDURES — Monday, 12:30-3 p.m., room 2. Fee \$25. A course which deals with the techniques to provide the student with review and skill development to function in an office. Students can work on calculators, typewriters, dictaphone, business forms and filing. Materials approximately \$5. Limiting to 12.

TYPING, BEGINNING I — Tuesday, 1:30-3:30 p.m., room 2. Fee \$20. An introductory course for beginning students. Electric typewriters. Book extra.

TYPING, BEGINNING II — Wednesday, 10-12 a.m., room 2. Fee \$20. This course is a continuation of the beginning typing class or for those who know the keyboard but have minimal speed. Bring paper.

TYPING, INTERMEDIATE — Tuesday, 10-12 a.m., room 2. Fee \$30. For those who know the keyboard and can type approximately 25 words per minute. 16 weeks. Class begins Jan. 25 and continues through June 7.

TYPING REVIEW — Thursday, 1:30-3:30 p.m., room 2. Fee \$20. For those who type and wish to improve their speed and accuracy. In addition, tabulation, business letters, simple reports and manuscripts will be covered. Bring paper.

DANCE/EXERCISE — Monday, 9:30-10:30 a.m., gym. Fee \$15. A combination of ballet barre stretches and jazz combinations to music. Trim those added inches while you learn to dance.

WOMEN'S FITNESS — Gym. Fee \$15. Physical fitness is how you feel and how you look. You will learn how to check your heart rate. Comfortable clothing and tennis shoes. Tuesday, 10-11 a.m.; Wednesday, 10-11 a.m.; Wednesday, 4:30-5:30 p.m.

TOTAL FITNESS — Gym. Fee \$15. A combination of several forms of exercise. Begins with yoga - stretching and toning muscles while improving cardiovascular and respiratory systems. It continues with aerobics. It con-

cludes with relaxation exercises. Exercises accompanied with music. Tuesday, 1-2:15 p.m.; Thursday, 10-11:15 a.m.

WELCOME TO THE WORLD OF COMPUTERS — Tuesday and Thursday, 7-9 p.m. in Eagle Elementary School in the Media Center. Fee \$15. An introductory class designed to acquaint the student with computer use and operation; selecting appropriate software; comparison of machines. For Adults Only. Limited enrollment.

INTRODUCTION TO PROGRAMMING IN THE BASIC LANGUAGE — Wednesday, 7-9 p.m. in East Middle School, room 228. Fee \$25. An introductory class to the use and programming of the new microcomputers. For Adults Only. Limited enrollment.

PROGRAMMING IN BASIC LANGUAGE II — Thursday, 7-9 p.m. in Harrison High School in room 391. Fee \$25. A continuation of the Basic Language I class. For Adults Only. Limited enrollment.

GROUND SCHOOL FOR PRIVATE PILOT RATING — Wednesday, 7-10 p.m. in room 7. Fee \$45. Course covers the fundamentals of aircraft structure, aerodynamics, meteorology, pilotage and radio navigation. Includes preparation for Private Pilot FAA written ex-
