Residents are invited to attend the Farmington Hills Energy Committee for a discussion at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday in the Farmington Hills City Administration Building at 11 Mile and Orchard Lake roads.
The committee of 14 is working to develop a plan for a continuing energy program for the city.
The state of Michigan Energy Administration chose Farmington Hills and five other communities from a field of 19 applicants to participate in the Community Energy Management Program. The program was developed to help Michigan communities achieve their potential for energy efficiency. It is made possible by funding from the Energy Administration/Michigan Department of Commerce.

Duties of the committee will be to plan, develop and promote ways to help residents manage their energy usage. In a future of escalating energy costs, the committee's goals will include fostering awareness of ways to save energy dollars.

To manage the residential component of the program, the committee will schedule communitywide thermogram viewings in late fall. At these neighborhood viewings homeowners will see an infrared picture of their homes. These pictures will show areas of heat loss, where warm air needlessly escapes from the home.
Committee members and trained volunteers then will provide information to homeowners on ways to solve their particular heat loss problems.

In addition to promoting the residential component of the program, the committee will promote and develop the small-business/industry analysis program and the municipal program.
The small-business/industry energy analysis program provides an energy analysis to the city's small businesses.
The committee will work with the city to promote and adopt energy conservation measures to reduce energy consumption in municipal buildings and in transport services, to expand employee awareness, and to plan more effectively for energy emergencies.
