**Fire investigated**

The cause of a fire that gutted three mobile homes is listed as suspicious, Farmington Hills fire officials said. That fire, which severely damaged two other mobile homes, occurred just before 6 a.m. Feb. 18.

"There was no natural source of ignition that we could find," Lt. Richard Marinucci said. The mobile homes were not yet hooked up to electrical or gas outlets.

The five mobile homes owned by Matthew Ranker of the Little Valley

Mobile Home Park, were being stored at 30760 Eight Mile, immediately behind the Timmer Construction Co., when the fire broke out, Marinucci said.

At least \$50,000 damage was caused to the five mobile homes, Marinucci said.

The fire was under control within 20 minutes and was prevented from spreading to the other 20-25 mobile homes stored behind the construction firm, Marinucci said.

Survivors include her daughter, Margaret Londa; five grandchildren. Services were Feb. 21 at the Wm. R. Hamilton Co. Funeral Home, Birmingham, with the Rev. Al Kuhn officiating.
