## WHAT MOST PARENTS DON'T KNOW

### ASK THE DOCTOR

The law states that your child must be immunized with DPT vaccine before attending school. A good law. DPT vaccine has almost eliminated pertussis (whooping cough), once a childhood killer. But are parents aware of the vaccine's inherent dangers? One recent study suggests that 1 child in 875 may have an adverse reaction to DPT. There is potential danger, including cerebral palsy, mental retardation, brain damage and paralysis. And further evidence exists that crib death, sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), may be directly related. Symptoms, such as a shocklike state, seizure, screaming, high fever, allergic reaction, swelling, cough or convulsions are warning signals.

Under the law you and your child may be entitled to compensation. If your child, or the child of someone you care about, had DPT vaccine and has similar problems, first contact your doctor. Then ask for a second opinion, a legal opinion. No fee until we win.
