Hospice care course taught
 Three courses in hospice care will be offered at Madonna College beginning in September. "Fundamental Concepts in Hospice Care" will meet on Mondays 7-10 p.m. This course emphasizes the physical, emotional and spiritual support for terminally ill persons and their loved ones, covers the history of the hospice movement and reveals recent studies done in the hospice field.
