 plained, he cannot really be suspended.
 But Christy has not been called to duty since the July 3 shooting and is not likely to be called to duty within the near future, said Brennan.
 The other silent witness is Patrolman Noah Wurmack who was on the scene of the Kephart shooting. Wurmack has not made any statements but will not be suspended, explained Brennan, because he fired a gun at the scene and has the right to remain silent under fear of self-incrimination.
 Brennan reported that the officers on the scene of the Kephart shooting were not allowed to file a formal report until the report was read and approved by a P.O. attorney.
 Brennan said Chief Yates was on vacation at the time of the Kephart shooting and did not learn about it until Sept. 5, three days before warrants were issued.
 But Yates did not talk to any of the officers involved in the Kephart shooting until the warrants were issued, said Brennan. Yates returned to duty Sept. 9.

All tribes participate in the three seasonal Indian Guide week-end camps, the popcorn sale, pancake supper, and the Memorial Day Parade. All of these programs are designed to give the boys a chance to develop their own initiative with the guidance of their dads. And often these activities prove to give as much pride to the dads as to the sons.

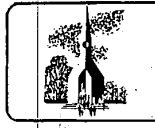
