

# Vote Returns Reveal Heavy Local Splitting

An analysis of Tuesday's election results indicates that about 15% of the Farmington Township residents split their votes in the local contests for trustee and treasurer.

The split favored the Democratic candidates, who lost anyway. The local Democrats ran from 11-13% higher than their counterparts for State Senate, House and U.S. Congress.

Conversely, the Republican candidates for trustee and treasurer ran about 10% behind the GOP candidates for House, Senate and Congress.

**analysis**  
An analysis of the key state races, those in which party lines held, indicate Farmington Township's vote was about 55% Republican, 33% Democratic, and 12% independent.

On the state level, there was a lot of ballot splitting in these races: Hart-Romney; Austin-Lockwood; Kelley-Farr; and the State Supreme Court.

However, for the most part, township Republicans voted in a bloc for Raymond Baker, Carl Pursell and Jack McDonald. In fact, McDonald picked up almost all of the independent voters while Baker and Pursell received at least half of the independent votes.

McDONALD RECEIVED 65% of the vote in capturing another term in Congress from the 19th District. Pursell received 60% of the township vote in his race for State Senate in the 14th District. Baker also got 60% of the township vote to get re-elected to the House in the 5th District.

It appears that the independent voters, local Democrats received about 10% and Republicans about 2%.
