

Will Teachers Strike Within Two Weeks?

FARMINGTON Labor negotiations have reached the point where Farmington school teachers may withhold services within two weeks unless the school board ratifies the 1970-71 master contract.

The school board Monday night failed to ratify the contract with teachers and asked its negotiating team to re-open negotiations on a couple of points.

That failure to ratify has resulted in a terse statement from Roger Allen, executive director of the Farmington Education Association (FEA) which is the sole bargaining agent for Farmington teachers.

THE BOARD'S failure to ratify "took the association by considerable surprise because we were operating

under the false impression the contract would be ratified," says Allen.

Allen said a meeting was held Wednesday, Nov. 25, with teachers asked to approve or reject the 70-71 contract as negotiated. Allen said he expects teachers will vote to accept the contract.

The master agreement, agreed upon by both negotiating teams, has been printed and distributed to teachers adds Allen.

"The FEA will not involve itself in any further negotiations on the 1970-71 master contract. Our executive board will agree to either accept or reject that contract as now printed but we will not negotiate on any proposed amendments to the printed contract."

The FEA also is insisting that all provisions of the con-

tract be made retroactive to Sept. 8, the first day of school.

IF THE CONTRACT is ratified by the teachers, Allen continues, the school board will be given until Dec. 1 to ratify.

If the board does not ratify by Dec. 1, Allen explains, the FEA will convene a meeting with teachers and recommend that services be withheld.

A walkout will be recommended by the FEA, executive board, Allen specified, if the school board does not ratify the contract as now printed and if it is not made retroactive to Sept. 8.
