EDITORIAL
FORGET THE RAPS THIS TIME

Every citizen interested in the growth and development of the Grand River section cannot but be gratified by the fact that Farmington business men and officials have again taken up the work of bringing to realization the hopes for a Wider Grand River. Every motorist who uses Grand River avenue beyond Redford has reason to view the movement with satisfaction—and has an interest in its successful culmination.

The decision of the State Administrative Board some weeks ago to add half a mile to the widening program presented an opportunity—more, a challenge to everyone who is interested in relief from the almost unbearable congestion between Farmington and Redford. It would have been strange, indeed, and a sad commentary upon this section's alertness, or lack of it, had the situation been allowed to pass without an attempt to persuade state officials that the widening program must go on, at least to the City of Farmington.

But the challenge, fortunately, has been met, and now that the plans are under way for a new effort, it is to be hoped that there will be among all those most eagerly interested, that harmony which alone will spell success. It would seem that in a cause so vital to all who make their homes in the vicinity of Grand River, the inevitable differences and disagreements as to how to carry on the movement, what the main line of effort should be, and so on, could be submerged in the unanimous attempt to bring about this great improvement.

Express car service—Wider Grand River—great things are in store for the Grand River section if its citizens but reach out their hands for them. But it will be impossible to succeed unless those who might disagree with the majority on minor points, resist the temptation to do a little "rapping across the knuckles."
