EDITORIAL

THE GOVERNOR IS WITH US

To every man, woman and child interested in the growth of Farmington and the Grand River section, the most encouraging news in a long time is the declaration of Governor Fred Green that the widening of Grand River avenue to Farmington is one of the first things on the State Highway program, as soon as additional road money is secured.

It is particularly satisfying to note, also, the Governor's statement that he recognizes Grand River as the second most important highway leading out of Detroit, and that it shall have consideration in keeping with this importance. Grand River, unfortunately, has not heretofore been accorded the attention its volume of traffic demands; it has on the other hand, been to some extent neglected while the widening and improvement of other highways has proceeded somewhat out of proportion to their relative importance.

Now, however, it appears that Grand River is to come into its own as the great highway from Detroit to Central Michigan and the state capital. The Governor's statement shows that he is fully aware, not only of the wretched condition of the present pavement between Farmington and Redford, but that also that a 20-foot pavement for this stretch of the road is ridiculous.

No one can say of course, just when the work of widening and improving Grand River to Farmington will be accomplished. The shortage of highway money which occurred, unfortunately, just as Grand River was about to receive its just consideration, makes the matter problematical. Many believe, and it is probably true, that the outcome of the test case on the three-cent gas tax will have an important bearing on this as well as all other state highway work.

But it is gratifying, indeed, to know that the man who sits in the executive chair at Lansing is fully aware, not only of the present intolerable condition, but of the requirements for the future. Such a recognition from high officials spells a bright future for Grand River indeed.

IT MIGHT BE WORSE!

Michigan smokers are lucky, even if some of the state's motorists think they are not. Those who are smokers as well as motorists certainly have no cause to complain. Read this Michigan news item:

Michigan's three-cent gasoline tax law has been declared unconstitutional in an opinion handed down by Judge Miller, of the Wayne circuit court. The fight on gas tax now is up to the state supreme court which is reviewing the case. The third cent was added to the gas tax last winter to aid in carrying out an extensive highway program.

And now read this from 'Alabama': Alabama recently began collection of a 15 per cent tax on the sale of cigars and cigarettes. The tax is expected to yield some \$4,000,000 annually. Moral—Look around before kicking.
