**EDITORIAL**

WELCOME WORDS FROM MR. SMITH

Eighty men broke into well-justified applause Wednesday noon when Del A. Smith, general manager of the Detroit Department of Street Railways, speaking at the Farmington Exchange Club, assured those present that street car service to Farmington may be expected in the near future. No more satisfying statement could have been asked for by those who gathered to evidence to Mr. Smith their unified desire for trolley service and their readiness to support it.

Mr. Smith's statement quoted above, along with his prediction that Grand River avenue is next in Detroit on which the new express service will be instituted, cannot but meet with the approval of everyone.

Yet there are probably many who did not realize just how far Mr. Smith did go in his assertions, and how much it meant to him to speak as he did. Mr. Smith declared to his audience without reservation, that they "may look for the realization of the improved service you have anticipated, in the near future."

With all the political vicissitudes that public servants must expect, with all the considerations that must be given to changes in plans of departments of public works, Mr. Smith must have felt he stood on very firm ground in making such encouraging statements. Mr. Smith is experienced enough in public affairs to sidestep the issue and talk generalities if he had desired to do so. In the fact that he did not hesitate to make definite assertions, lies the greatest significance of his address.

That Mr. Smith added to his predictions of early extension of car service his opinion that "no other area in the state has so great an opportunity for development with Detroit's rapid growth," is still a further cause for elation. Coming from a man so well acquainted with every community in the Metropolitan Area as is Mr. Smith, this was a welcome word indeed.

**ANOTHER GREAT HIGHWAY PROJECT**

So many great and important projects are planned for communities in this section within the near future that it is difficult to assign to each its separate significance. Yet there can be no doubt that the building of the Maple road as a superhighway from Grand River avenue to Lake St. Clair will take its place as one of the great transportation achievements of Michigan.

A casual glance at the map of the Metropolitan Detroit and suburbs will show that this new superhighway will not only provide a through cross-road from the east to the west side of the Metropolitan Area, avoiding the congestion of downtown Detroit—it will cut the distance from this section to Mt. Clemens, for instance, almost in half. It will bring the industrial east side within reasonable travelling distance of the west side—the pres-

ent separation by many miles of congested streets and at least an hour and a half in time, which has been a handicap to both east and west sides, will be in a large measure overcome.

It is almost impossible to over-estimate the importance to this new superhighway, not only to the territory through which it passes, but to everyone living in and around Detroit. It will probably be years before its great benefits are fully appreciated.

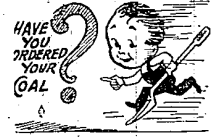
