The High School students and the C. E. members are giving a program for the dedication of the American flag Sunday evening December 18, at West Point Park Church.

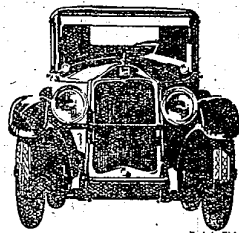
We are glad to hear that Harvey Crase has returned from the hospital and is getting along nicely.

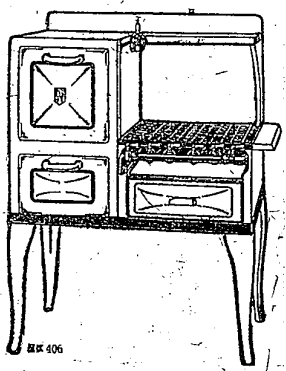
