# Dual Park Ceremony Opens Michigan Week

A dual event will fill the new Drake Road Park in the City of Farmington Saturday, May 15, with more than 600 expected to participate.

Saturday will begin with the awards breakfast at 8 a.m. in the Farmington Masonic Temple with the City of Farmington Beautification Committee handing awards to those who have helped beautify the city.

A COUPLE hours after the breakfast ends, a parade will begin on Grand River and end at the Drake Park for formal dedication ceremonies for the park and official opening of the South Farmington Little League season.

Alta Loma, west on Alta Loma to Gill south on Gill to Arundel and west to the Longacre Elementary School which lies adjacent to the Drake Park.

THE PARK dedication will be held first with introductions being made by Farmington City Manager John Dinan who administered the applications for state and federal matching funds to build the city's second community park.

Following the invocations, the national anthem will be played by the Farmington Junior High Band with Paul Barber, Harrison High band director, conducting.

After the welcoming address by Farmington Mayor Wilbur Brotherton, comments will be made by Congressman McDonald, Sen. Pursell and Rep. Baker.

Local dignitaries present will include Quakertown President Frank Lockhart, Chamber of Commerce President John Anhalt, Farmington Jaycee President Frank Hill and Michigan Week Chairman John Courville. Also present will be members of the city council and planning commission, township and Farmington school trustees.

RIBBON CUTTING by McDonald and Brotherton will end the park dedication and be followed immediately by ceremonies to open the South Farmington Little League season.

Charles E. Smith, Little League director, will introduce Robert Rounds, commissioner of the South Farmington league, who will make an address.

A presentation will then be made by the Ohio baseball team which was eliminated last summer by the South Farmington All-Stars in district playoffs. The South Farmington team was one game away from playing for

the world championship title last year.

League directors to be introduced include William Commetto, Fritz Wenson, Edward Day and Edward Kempf.
