8 compared to McKendrick's 76. Ironically, it was York and McKendrick who tangled the most during the final candidate forums. Debate centered on the main-road busing of secondary students.

to gain momentum as the campaign progressed. She had the support of the school establishment from the onset, including an endorsement from the coordinating council of the teachers' union. She also had a crew of volunteers, at least one at all eight precincts.

"I have the best friends in the whole world," Feldman said. "Better than the win was the friendships extended to me. That's what made this win so special — my friends."

Feldman also stayed out of any heated exchanges during the three candidate forums.

"That's not my style; I don't play dirty," she said. "I believe we can always work things through positive methods."

Julia Glazer and Terry Fobbs were the only other candidates to show up at city hall. Charles Remus, Kenneth Stein and Joel Marwil were not present when the final tally was announced.

Fobbs arrived at city hall to find out he finished fifth with 438 votes. He admitted being new to the district hurt his cause, but added he plans to stay involved. Said Fobbs: "To quote Arnold Schwarzenegger, 'I'll be back.'"
