

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

VANDALISM
The left side of a 1993 red Mercury Sable parked on Clouster Circle in Farmington Hills was "keyed" causing \$200 in damage Aug. 17.

THEFT

FIRES

Farmington Hills firefighters from station 3 arrived at an apartment fire on Timberidge Circle at 5:55 p.m. Aug. 17 that the apartment manager had put out with a chemical extinguisher. Grease in an unattended frying pan had caught fire. The resulting fire caused \$2,000 in damage to the apartment and \$200 in damage to contents.

Varnish remover being used to clean basement floors of an apartment complex on Lytle in Farmington Hills caught fire Aug. 18 at 11 a.m. resulting in \$5,000 in damage to the structure and \$4,000 in damage to contents. Firefighters from station 1 put out the fire. There were no injuries.

Farmington Hills firefighters from station 2 put out a fire at a house on Clairview at about 2:15 p.m. Aug. 18. A dryer had caught

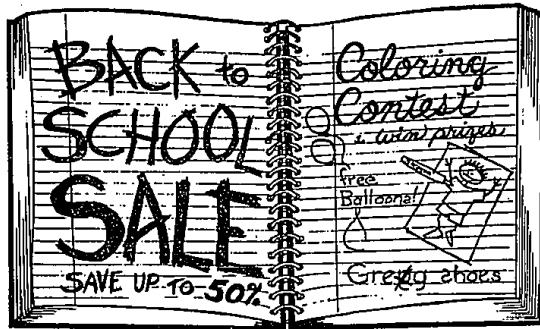
fire. The fire caused \$5,000 in damage to the building and \$15,000 to contents. Farmington Hills firefighters from stations 1 and 3 put out a fire at a house on Willow Lane at about 3:20 a.m. A tree had fallen across electrical lines, causing one tree to fall. The electrical panel inside the house was too hot to touch. Power was cut off, and a small fire resulting from the overload in the wall near the bath-

room was extinguished. There was \$15,000 in damage to the house and \$1,000 in damage to contents.

A Farmington Hills woman said she was grabbed by the throat and neck by another person after she parked her car at Orchard-10 IGA in Farmington Aug. 18. The two nearly collided while driving into the parking lot.

An Important Message for MetroVision Customers...

The Federal Communications Commission requires that all cable rates be changed effective September 1, 1993, in accordance with the new Cable Act. The legislation requires changes in cable rates, services and equipment. The rules require that we price our cable service on a per channel basis and price our equipment on actual costs.

The FCC has "frozen" cable company revenues until November 15, but has encouraged repackaging and re-pricing of our services to comply with the new rate guidelines. Even though some customers' rates may go up, others will go down. The FCC has stated that MetroVision or any other cable company cannot realize an increase in revenues from these rate adjustments.

We hope you have appreciated our efforts to keep our rates low, and we are disappointed that some subscribers are experiencing rate increases as a result of the FCC's new pricing guidelines.
