

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

THEFTS
An employee at Bob Saks on Grand River in Farmington Hills was given permission to drive a white 1995 Dodge Neon worth \$14,000 home March 31 and return it April 1. He never returned with the car. Efforts to contact him have been unsuccessful.

When officers cut the car off, another man drove up from behind and warned officers that the teens had a gun. They had a .22 caliber Derringer pistol and three spent shells. Officers heard of a complaint of gunshots in the

area. The four were arrested and a fifth was questioned in the matter.
BRIKAR-INS

Farmington police arrested a Farmington man, 73, for drunken driving April 6 at Meadowlark and Laskapur April 6. Police stopped the 1993 Cadillac after it was drifting on the road. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .15 percent.
SPOUSE ABUSE

a Section 35 residence. The man was intoxicated and was restrained by another man.
