"I've never seen someone suffering this much," Stanyar said as her client, dressed in a flannel shirt, tan dungarees and canvas shoes, sat impassively unaware of what was being said.
But Oakland County assistant prosecuting attorney Paul Walton said that Koga was a risk to herself and could flee the country if freed.
"There's an extreme risk of flight," he said. "There are not sufficient safeguards in a private hospital."

Oakland Circuit Court Judge Jessica Cooper will hear defense arguments for a change of bond this morning at 9:30 a.m. Bond has been denied so far.
At Friday's preliminary exam, Parker bound over Koga on first degree murder based on the requirement of premeditation and based on the felony murder statute.
Judge Parker said that did not require any judgment on the guilt of the defendant or her mental capacity at this stage. Parker said testimony showed that the woman walked a long distance with the child, dressed for the weather but did not dress the baby for the cold, told no one that the baby was at the pond until questioned later and did not attempt to rescue the child.
The autopsy showed that the child died from drowning, Judge Parker said.

P.S. Although management of spinal stenosis usually involves such conservative measures as physical therapy, surgical correction may be considered when pain is disabling or weakness increases in the legs.

BETTER DETECTION OF PREMATURE BIRTH
Premature birth puts infants at higher risk for heart and lung disorders, cerebral palsy, learning disabilities, and other neurological problems. For these reasons alone, an obstetrician carefully monitors his or her patient for symptoms of preterm labor, such as pelvic pressure and cervical changes, to make the decision if a woman needs early hospitalization or treatment to prevent labor or to mate the baby's lungs mature faster. However, there are times when women who give birth early have no symptoms. To counter this problem, the FDA has recently given approval to a new test that can help predict premature birth. The test involves the use of a vaginal smear to detect fetal fibronectin, a chemical that signals the likelihood of delivery at 37 weeks or less. Research showed that 86% of women with preterm labor symptoms who tested positive delivered prematurely.
In this country, 400,000 babies are born prematurely each year.
