

POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

The following are police and fire incidents that occurred in Farmington and Farmington Hills during the past week.

BURGLARY
In Farmington Hills:
 A .38 caliber pistol, .22 caliber pistol, .25 automatic pistol and a 9-millimeter Luger were stolen along with men's jewelry from a Cordoba Apartments residence on 12 Mile Road between Feb. 23-26. STRONG-ARM ROBBERY
In Farmington Hills:
 A 19-year-old Hills woman told police a man robbed her of \$296 after he jumped from behind an evergreen tree and grabbed her hair while she was walking south of Rockwell at 11:07 p.m. Feb. 27. She allowed the man, who fell, and she ran to BJ's Party Store where she phoned police. Her coat was ripped during the struggle. She was on her way to the party store to buy an envelope to put her rent money inside. The robber is described as a black male in his 20s, 6 feet tall and weighing 300 pounds. He was wearing dark pants, hip length coat and a knit hat with either a Fila or Nike logo embroidered on it.

DRUNKEN DRIVING
In Farmington Hills:

BURGLARY ARREST
