

POLICE AND FIRE NEWS

The following are police and fire incidents that occurred in Farmington and Farmington Hills during the past week.
In Farmington Hills: Someone absconded with a woman's purse that contained \$339 cash and credit cards from an unlocked 1996 Dodge van parked at First Presbyterian Church on Farmington Road Nov. 20. The victim said a man had come into the church earlier saying he lost his job and needed money.

A thief now has a .22 caliber revolver in his arsenal after stealing the gun from a Lamar Street residence sometime between Aug. 1 and Nov. 20. The gun is registered.
A woman's wallet was stolen from the purse of a mother visiting her son at Botsford Hospital Nov. 20.
Someone stole a diamond ring, men's watch and between \$30-40 cash from a Crosswinds residence on Country Way Nov. 21.
DRUNKEN DRIVING
In Farmington Hills: Police arrested a Detroit man, 31, for drunken driving on west-bound M-5 and Farmington Road Nov. 20. Police stopped the 1986 Chevy Cavalier after it was trying to move out of the center median. The driver stumbled out of the car and appeared to have urinated on himself. He said he had two beers, but his blood alcohol level was .20 percent - twice the legal limit.
Police arrested a Farmington Hills man, 52, for drunken driving on northbound Haggerty and Heatherbrook at 2:30 a.m. Nov.

21. Police questioned the driver after his 1998 Mercury Sable went over the curb. He had a blood alcohol level of .18 percent.
Police arrested a Troy woman, 23, for drunken driving on Grand River and Drake at 2:15 a.m. Nov. 22. She had a blood alcohol level of .12 percent.
VEHICLE FIRE
In Farmington Hills: Firefighters put out a 1983 Ford Ranger that was engulfed in flames on 11 Mile and Halsted at 10:35 p.m. Nov. 20. The driver said the Ranger stalled and

wouldn't restart before he noticed the flames coming out from under the hood. The truck was a total loss at \$3,000.
BURGLARIES
In Farmington Hills: Someone cut the padlock to a storage shed and stole a table saw, drill press, grinder, air compressor and hammer drill at Jumbo Video on Middlebelt between Nov. 19-20.
A thief gained entry by breaking a window at Michigan Boat Works on Grand River Nov. 21. It was unknown what was stolen.
Someone broke a basement window to get inside a house on Hitching Post Court between Nov. 18-20, which caused \$58 damage. A similar break-in took place at the home a year ago, the homeowner told police.
BREAKINGS
In Farmington Hills: Someone tore the plastic sheet covering a broken window and stole an amplifier from a car parked at Bonaventure Skating Rink on Halsted Nov. 21.
A thief stole the rear glass window and liberated a stereo and speakers from a 1990 Nissan parked on Middlebelt Nov. 22.

He said the driver of the vehicle flashed his lights at him and he pulled over when the assault occurred. He followed the man's vehicle and got his license plate number. The other driver came to Farmington Hills police to explain his side, saying the man cut him off. He denied assaulting him.

In Farmington Hills: The police undercover unit arrested a pair of Fowlerville men, 43, and 33, after finding three rocks of crack cocaine in the 1998 Ford Ranger they were in on Grand River and Eight Mile early morning Nov. 23. Police had the vehicle under surveillance as it went into Detroit and returned to the area.
