Edgar S. Pierce of Farmington is second vice-president of the Association.

On the program will be Dr. Henry D. Chadwick, controller of tuberculosis work in Detroit with the Detroit Department of Health, Dr. E. J. O'Brien, tuberculosis specialist and chest surgeon, consultant in chest surgery at the Oakland County Tuberculosis Sanatorium, Herman Keifer Hospital, Detroit, and the Wm. Maybury Sanatorium, Northville. Dr. O'Brien will talk on "Viewpoints of Modern Treatment of Tuberculosis."

Joe Brooks, Birmingham, will play several numbers of Old Time music on the violin. Mrs. J. L. Oliver, Birmingham, will sing a group of songs.

The banquet and program will be followed by dancing from 9 to 1.
