**Township Salaries Cut; Deadlock On Two**

(Continued from page one) proposal to make it \$1,400 this year brought a tie vote. Another suggestion was that it be put back on a previous basis, one per cent of the collections, plus \$200 for extra work on the delinquent tax. This was opposed, as unfair, because the township some years ago discarded the percentage basis in order to hold down the treasurer's pay when collections were soaring and it would be inequitable to ask the treasurer to take remuneration on that basis now with collections falling off and the work much greater. It was estimated that the one per cent would give the treasurer not over \$1,000.

An offer by Highway Commissioner Clayton Goers to accept a 10 per cent cut in his last year's pay of 72 cents an hour was accepted, the 72 cents having been a reduction of ten per cent from the previous year.

**Drastic Cuts**

The Board adopted drastic cuts in the pay for labor, teams and tractors. Road overseers last year received 54 cents an hour for labor, 99 cents an hour with team, and \$1.67 with tractor. This was cut to 48.6 cents for labor, 60 cents with team, and \$1.25 with tractor. In regard to general labor it was suggested that much of the labor should be available from the welfare list.

The deadlocks developed through the fact that Justice Blanchard insisted upon cuts of at least 15 per cent throughout, in addition to the 10 per cent last year, while the other three members concerned themselves chiefly with the amount of work to be done in each case, but could not all agree as to what the exact amount of compensation should be.
