Clarenceville Schools Increase To Twelve Grades

Enlargement Made Necessary By New Residents

The Board of Education of Clarenceville Public Schools, District No. Five, Fractional, voted to run the school through the twelfth grade at a meeting held early in the spring...

This will enable the boys and girls to attend school locally and will not cause the parents to spend all the extra money that they have been compelled to spend in the past for transportation...

The Board also took into consideration the fact that the local community might as well receive the State Aid on these same children instead of having it sent out to various other surrounding High School districts...

The Board also made arrangements with Redford, Dearborn and Farmington to use the gymnasium in the Volney Smith School for basketball, high school plays and other high school activities...

New courses to be added this fall are Mechanical Drawing, American History, American Government, Spanish, Advanced Latin, Trigonometry, Physics, Consumer Buying, Bookkeeping, Music, English Literature, Shop, Home Economics and Training.

Soon after school starts the University of Michigan will be invited in to approve the school as a fully accredited High School so that boys and girls who attend school in Clarenceville will be able to attend colleges and universities throughout the country...

The Board of Education has new plans all drawn by architects for a new building for the district, immediately upon the end of the war. These new plans call for an addition of 16 classrooms, cafeteria, health rooms and a gymnasium. These will be added on to the present High School building. The seventh through the twelfth grades will attend school on Middle Belt Road. The Central School on Eight Mile Road will have the first through the sixth grades. The Edgewood School will house the Kindergarten, first, second and third grades. All children in the first, second and third grades living north of Grand River and east of Inkster Road will attend the Edgewood School. All others in these grades will attend Central School.

Buses will run on the first day of school with the same schedule that was used on the last day of school. The Office of Defense Transportation has allowed the school to continue with limited schedules due to traffic hazards, and distances to many children (Continued on Page Eight)
