City Pick-Up Will Be Made This Saturday

All arrangements for the City of Farmington paper pick-up scheduled for Saturday afternoon, January 27, have been completed.

"We hope and trust local citizens will give us plenty of paper for the war effort," commented John Hunt, general chairman of the City and Township Salvage Committee. Bayard Tupper, salvage committee member, is in charge of the pick-up, which will get under way about one o'clock in the afternoon.

The salvage committee makes an urgent appeal to every resident for paper, which at present is one of the most critically needed items for the war effort. Ninety-five per cent of the cartons used by the Red Cross to send parcels to our prisoners of war in Germany and Japan are made by Michigan paper mills and these mills are now operating only two days each week.

These are all excellent reasons for the salvage committee to again appeal to the citizens of Farmington for their cooperation. Please place your paper, tied in bundles, at the curb early on Saturday, ready for the pick-up.
