Lecture Examines Galapagos Islands

The lecture will be given by James A. O. Crowe, outdoors writer for the Detroit News, who recently took a trip to the Galapagos Islands.

The public is invited to view, free of charge, the 90 slides taken from a selection of 500 photographs by Crowe during his two-week visit in May at the height of the mating display period for many of the unique island birds.

A NATIVE OF Scotland, Crowe came to the U.S. in 1928, graduated from Lincoln High School in Ferndale and the University of Michigan.

After service in the Royal Canadian Air Force, Crowe worked for the Daily Tribune in Royal Oak and later spent eight years as capitol correspondent and outdoors writer for the Associated Press in Lansing.

During those eight years, he wrote a weekly outdoors column for Michigan Associated Press and covered the State Conservation Department.

He has received a number of awards for his conservation reporting and is a member of the Fishing Hall of Fame.

Dental Health Series Begins
FARMINGTON
Almost half the children in kindergarten, second and fifth grades in Farmington School District benefited last year from topical fluoride applications.

This dental health program is being offered again in Farmington elementary schools. Children enrolled for treatments receive a thorough cleaning of the teeth and four applications of the decay preventing fluoride solution.

Fee for the service is \$7 which covers cost for the program. Notices are sent home with children in kindergarten, second and fifth grades about a week before the hygienist, Mrs. Leone Crowson, arrives at the school.

Any questions regarding the fluoride program may be directed to Nicholas Abid, principal of William Grace Elementary School. Abid is co-chairman with Dr. James C. Rennell of the Farmington Topical Fluoride Committee.
