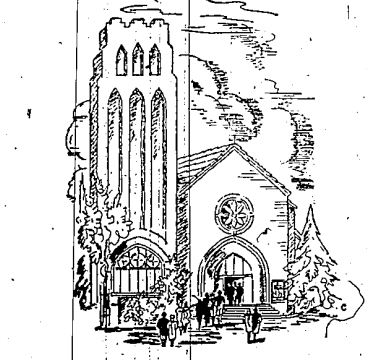

Zoning Recommendations Await Final Approval

Several amendments to the City of Farmington Zoning Ordinance have been proposed by the Board of Appeals, many were submitted at last week's meeting of the City Commission for approval of that body, by Paul R. Schreiber, chairman of the Board of Appeals.

The first amendment would permit the Board of Appeals to authorize the construction of a motor supply station in a Commercial A District, under conditions specified in Section 253 of the Ordinance, only after holding a public hearing.

A second amendment, in the same trend, would permit the Board of Appeals to approve construction of a service garage or a motor supply station in a Commercial B District, under Section 255 of the Zoning Ordinance.
