New Resolution Calls For Special Election

The Board of Education of the Farmington Township School District, at a special meeting held Monday, January 21, passed a resolution to submit a proposal to the voters to raise five mills for five years, earmarked for building and site fund for a new high school. The motion was introduced by Isaac Bond and supported by Howard Warner. The vote was by acclamation. No time was set for the election.

Following the vote, Jess Early moved that space be found outside of the present school building throughout the district for housing students when the need arises. The motion was supported by Warner, and passed.

Paul Schriber Presented a 6-point building program at the beginning of the meeting.

1. Immediate action in selecting an architect to work with the Superintendent to integrate a comprehensive building program, to include a High school and necessary elementary rooming. 2. Proceed on construction to relieve immediate congestion in Farmington and Noble School areas. This work to be started by the end of March and be ready for occupancy by September.
