Teachers Ask Consideration Of Contracts

The Board of Education of the Farmington Township School District at the regular meeting held Monday, March 11, unanimously passed a motion that Orville E. Dunckel be re-elected to his position as Superintendent and offered a contract for five years at a salary of \$6,000 per year commencing July 1, 1946.

Dunckel, former superintendent of the Farmington schools, left the system in June, 1943 to accept a commission in the Army. Prior to his going into service, Dunckel served as superintendent for four years. On February 26, the Board voted not to renew present Supt. E. V. Ayres contract for next year.

Approximately 250 persons attended the March 11 meeting of the Board at the Farmington High School.

A petition was read from the Farmington school teachers asking the Board of Education to consider the following questions: "Distribution of additional state funds for current year, earmarked for teachers salaries. This state aid should be divided equally among added to 1945-1946 salaries as specified in contracts."

Howard Warner moved that special funds derived at the special session of the Board be earmarked for teachers' salaries be equally divided among the teachers of the Farmington School District in addition to 1945-46 salaries when received. Secured by Isaac Bond and carried.

James Dunckel moved that contracts be renewed by Superintendent E. V. Ayres by April 1 if possible. Bond seconded the motion. Paul Schreiber moved to amend the motion to read "on or before April 1, 1946" but was not seconded by the majority. Dunckel's motion passed three for, one against.

Warner moved that discussion of the salary schedule be arranged at the next regular meeting of the Board. Schreiber supported the motion and it passed unanimously.
